

# **Universal Periodic Review – 34th Session**


Overview and analysis of recommendations made on nationality and statelessness

November 2019

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The 34th session of the Universal Periodic Review (UPR 34) took place from 4 to 15 November 2019. The following countries were under review by the Human Rights Council during this Session: Angola, Bolivia (Plurinational State of), Bosnia and Herzegovina, Egypt, El Salvador, Fiji, Gambia, Iran (Islamic Republic of), Iraq, Italy, Kazakhstan, Madagascar, San Marino and Slovenia .

The Institute on Statelessness and Inclusion (ISI) collaborated with civil society partners to prepare country submissions on nationality and statelessness issues in Iraq (with Equality Now, the Coalition of Women MPs to Combat Violence against Women, Bagdad Women Association and Global Campaign for Equal Nationality Rights); Iran (with the Global Campaign for Equal Nationality Rights); Italy (with the *Consiglio Italiano per i Rifugiati* and the European Network on Statelessness);



Madagascar (with the Focus Development Association and the Global Campaign for Equal Nationality Rights, also available in French: <u>version Francaise</u>); and

**Slovenia** (with The Peace Institute and the European Network on Statelessness).<sup>1</sup> The Institute also prepared an <u>all country summary</u>, which provides an overview of the right to nationality and statelessness related challenges in all countries under review.

This document provides an overview and analysis of all recommendations on the right to nationality and statelessness that were made during the 34<sup>th</sup> Session of the UPR, on the basis of the draft reports adopted by the UPR Working Group, which can be accessed via UPR-Info.<sup>2</sup>



# General overview

A total of **38 recommendations** related to the right to a nationality, statelessness and birth registration were made, with 11 out of 14 countries under review receiving at least one recommendation.

**Slovenia**, **San Marino** and **Madagascar** received the most recommendations. Bolivia (Plurinational State of), El Salvador and Fiji did not receive any recommendations related to the right to a nationality, statelessness or birth registration. Uruguay, Honduras and Brazil were most active in making relevant recommendations.
